Sculpture gift graces our library

“Waiting for Daddy”, a lovely sculpture by widely known local artist Philippe Faraut, now adds a classic touch outside the entrance to the Honeoye Public Library.

The sculpture, a gift from Philippe and his wife Charisse, is of their two girls, Alexis (when she was 4) and Maddie (when she was 1).

The Farauts said they donated the piece to the library “as it was such an important place for the children when they were first exposed to the joy of reading (and listening).”

In accepting the gift, the library trustees decided to pay for the necessary bronzing and installation of the sculpture from the library’s Memorial Fund. The bronzing, freight and installation cost \$11,375.

The trustees thank all who have donated to the Memorial Fund.
